## How are parents informed about the dates for Assessments including Formative Assessments?

With the removal of Mid-Year Examination (MYE) in schools, ongoing non-weighted Formative Assessments (FA) serve to provide appropriate feedback on student learning. Being an integral part of the teaching and learning process, FA across all levels is carried out, taking into consideration the progress of students, pace of the class and at timely junctures such as immediately after a lesson or upon completion of a topic and not fixed.

Dates for Weighted Assessments (WA) and P6 Preliminary Examination are communicated in Letters to Parents. Parents can also refer to the **School Calendar** on the school website and download a copy on their own electronic devices such as smartphone and laptops. Essential information such as the scope and components of assessments are in the **Information Booklet for Parents** obtainable on the school website as well.

## Can the school reduce the number of out-of-classroom learning experiences so that students can focus on doing well in examination?
