Routines and Good Habits

From P1 onwards:

- Say "Please"/ "May I" when making request & say 'Thank you' to show appreciation
- 2. Good behaviour when in classroom, eg sitting up straight, staying attentive etc
- 3. Write name, class & date for every piece of work.
- 4. Neat Handwriting
- 5. Greet school staff
- 6. Neat personal appearance
- 7. Packing of school bag
- 8. Writing down homework in the student handbook

From P3 onwards:

- 1. Proper management and organisation of worksheets
- 2. Planning a personal time table

Out of School

- Ambassadors and representatives of Unity Primary School
- Words and actions on school image
- Portray school values

Dismissal from School

- Remind your child to go straight home from school after dismissal, if your child goes home by himself/herself.
- If he/she takes longer than usual to reach home, be interested and find out why.

School Security & Safe Management Measures (SMM)

School's SMM

- Make appointment to see teacher
- Staggered dismissal (P5 & P6 at 1.40pm)
- Read PG regularly & respond when required

- Remain contactable
- Other SMM measures (e.g. temperature taking, use of TraceTogether token, 1m distancing, wearing of masks, etc)

Parent Matters

Home-School Partnership

- 1. Students succeed when schools and parents work hand in hand to support students in learning self-management skills, taking responsibility and building resilience.
 - Good home routines
 - Conducive home environment for learning
 - Doing your child's homework
 - Going to the teacher for daily updates
 - Let your child forget to remember

Home-School Partnership

- **2. Mutual respect and trust** forms the strong foundation for positive engagement between schools and parents.
- Ask the teacher for the best way to contact him/ her.
- Respect the teacher's time.

Parents' Support

School Work:

- Provide time & space for your child to complete his/her work
- Establish a routine to ensure all work has been completed & packed into bag

Other support:

- Find out about your child's close friends
- Be informed about your child's daily activities. Remind them to go straight home after school.
- Provide motivation, encouragement & time for relaxation

Communication Channels


- Parents are encouraged to communicate with the teachers on any concern/feedback regarding their child.



Sharing of Concerns Relating to Students' Well-Being

Emotional Concerns for Upper Primary Students

- Friendship Issue (e.g. isolation, peer pressure)
- Negative self-concept, low self-esteem
- Anxiety Issue (e.g. exam stress)
- School withdrawals











LIDENTIFY Early Warning Signs

Internalized emotional problems

- Appears isolated from peers
 - Seems overly dependent on others
 - Is moody
- Shows feelings of helplessness
 - Is a bully victim
 - Cries frequently & easily
 - Abuses himself / herself

Externalized

emotional problems

- Becomes a discipline problem
 - Exhibits a lack of empathy or compassion
 - Has temper tantrums
 - Becomes impulsive
 - Becomes aggressive
 - Experiences poor academic performance
 - Bullies others



Peer Relationship Issues

- Exclusion
- Rejection
- Bullying
- Gossiping
- *Dealing with Peer Pressure







How to manage peer pressure?

- 1 Do not overreact
- Talk about what makes a true friend
- 3 Get to know your child's friends
- Talk about what independence really means
- Role Play Peer Pressure
- 6 Model saying 'No'



Self-Worth

Negative Adverse Effects

- Stress
- Lowers Self-Esteem & Self-Worth
- Shy Away from Social Situations
- Fosters Sibling Rivalry



Insufficient Sleep

- Reduced concentration
- Easily distracted
- Likely to be overweight
